5. Recycling

Charlie Brown confirmed that at the council-run recycling facility you can still drop off your soft plastics. This is important as Coles and Woolworths no longer accept these.

6. EV Recharge Station – MJ

MJ asked that an electric vehicle recycling station be located in Katoomba. LF suggested that Studleigh Place would be an ideal location. AT from BMCC replied that sites are being investigated and would get back to the KCCC.

7. Katoomba Street Update

The issue of CCTV was raised and TD asked whether there was any CCTV in Katoomba. TD also asked why wasn't the CCTV monitored by the council. AT replied that it would cost "millions to install and operate". MJ pointed out that this is ridiculous. The costs are substantially lower and most CCTV systems are operated by local councils.

The issue of a lack of toilets in Katoomba Street was raised yet again. AT attempted to answer with no clear guide given as to when Katoomba will get a set of toilets that are clean and do not need a 'Key'
